Greetings in this season of preparation and expectation,

It seems like I've missed Advent; which I'm beginning to understand in a way very different from Lent (which is usually explained as the preparation for Easter).

Yes, Advent does come directly before Christmas and historically Advent has been a time of preparation for the Joyous mystery of the Incarnation, which we celebrate at Christmas time; but as Christmas has become "bigger" in the process of marketing campaigns, Advent seems to have become something new: a refuge from the busyness of the Holiday Season and a time to nourish our souls as we remember the visions of the many prophets in our tradition that were haunted by dreams of the Reign of God.

It gives us time to mourn the world that is, as we remember the generations-long hope we participate in, present in the prophets, that keeps us pointed at the world that has already begun to break through but has not been fully realized: a world without sickness, famine, or war... A world, as I've said before, that looks more like God's dream and less like our nightmare.

As the culture around us begins early preparations around the celebration of the Christchild; may we be focused on the hope that Child represents for our world and the ways in which we can participate in that hope in our own time and place.
