We have been dealing with challenging news regarding our budget this year and even though we find ourselves more prepared for the days to come than some of our brothers and sisters across the diocese, the future is far from certain and our current way of doing business is not sustainable.

During the month of March the vestry is planning to host a conversation with the congregation on March 17 following the 1015 service to address your concerns and questions and begin to make plans for the future.. Please pray for us as we prepare for that conversation and check in with us about how you are doing.

We are not all reacting the same way; which is a healthy and beautiful reality when we are in community together; but even though we may not react the same way we can still hold space for each other and doing so is the foundation of a community

built on the transforming love of Jesus Christ.

So, as we walk through this Lent with self-examination and repentance let us pick up our cross and follow Jesus together into the future, where we know that resurrection joy and the gift of the Holy Spirit are waiting for us. Thank you for the privilege of serving as your Rector.

How do we figure this out? by Nancy Gregory, Senior Warden

In the weeks since our parish annual meeting, the importance of the budget information we received that day is sinking in. We thank our treasurer Tony for his courage and abilities to present it to us. We needed to hear it even though it was not welcome news. It was a shock, and now we are asking, how do we figure out what to do?

Canon Lee Curtis recently met with the Vestry to share his guidance and wisdom on this topic. We are not alone. Other churches in our diocese are similarly impacted. Many churches, including our very own Episcopal Church, have a tried-and-true method for working together in a group to find answers to big questions. It's called Discernment. Some call Discernment a meeting place of Prayer and Action. "It is learned by doing it, not just by reading about it." (Weeds Among the Wheat by T.H. Green, S.J., pg 13)

You've heard it said about Hannah and me. We have been in a Vocational Discernment Class since the season of Lent 2023. We were looking for an answer to the question, what is God's call for us? The same principles of that sort of discernment can be used for the budget question we now face as a congregation and even for other decisions you might be facing individually or as a family. Some of you may have heard me say that I was a Lay Spiritual Director for the calling process for a priest in a different diocese. Here are a few highlights of the process we used.

The first important thing was for us to remember God was with us, each one of us, always, reaching out to us in an invitation to join Jesus in His words, "Do not fear." Next, was prayer, needed throughout the process by each one of us individually, in groups and as a parish. In our prayers, we sometimes chose to read scripture, "not primarily for wise ethical instruction...but to encounter God in the person of Jesus Christ." (Weeds Among the Wheat by T.H. Green, S.J., pg 49)

We continued praying throughout as we continued to discern. Then we worked on gathering information, a period of reflection, weighing our choices, and finally confirmation. We did not rush. We took the time to hear God's guidance.

We at St. John's may not follow these steps in this way. We may call them something else. But the principles are the same. The Diocese will help us and guide us. Any decision we make, we will make together, as a loving congregation, with God's help, with lots of prayer, listening to each other's thoughts, grieving the fact that we must face this challenge, but also looking forward to the ministry opportunities that this decision will inevitably lead us. We have faith in God as He has faith in us. Amen
